Public Guardian and Trustee of BC: The Public Guardian and Trustee of British Columbia operates under provincial law to protect the legal rights and financial interests of children, ***to provide assistance to adults who need support for financial and personal decision making***, and to administer the estates of deceased and missing persons where there is no one else able to do so.
